Three Core PH Functions

Assessment

Regular collection, analysis and sharing of information about health conditions, risks and resources in a community

Policy Development

Use of assessment data to develop policy and direct resources toward those policies

Assurance

Availability of necessary services throughout the community



Seven Roles & Influence on People's Health

- Clinician: focus on holism, health promotion, & prevention while using expanded skills
- Educator: plan for community-wide impact
- Advocate: Support client self-determination and responsive systems



How Roles & Factors Influence People's Health

- Manager: Participative approach with community
- Collaborator: multidisciplinary collegiality and leadership
- Leadership: Change agent
- Researcher: Systematic investigation, collection, and analysis of data for solving problems and bring evidence-based findings to community settings

Nature & Common Threads Basic to Practice

- Many nursing roles
- Special skill sets
 - Assessment
 - Policy Development
 - Assurance
- Variety of clients in specific situations
- Collaboration with other institutions
 - Schools & Parishes
 - Occupational Health



Principles of Sound Community Nursing Practice

- Standards of practice
- Standards of care
- Management essential to all nursing roles
 - Community Nursing Process: assessment, planning, implementation, & evaluation
 - Case management
- Essential Behaviors
 - Decision-making
 - Transferring information
 - Relationship building
